The following are photographed sections of the *1864 Gilmer Map of Orange County* which show numerous fords over the Rapidan River in Orange County.

The map originated during the Civil War from: :

“The Confederate Engineer Bureau
in Richmond, VA. General J.F. Gilmer, Chief Engineer
--Presented to--
The Virginia Historical Society
By his only daughter, Mrs. J.F. Miris, Savannah, GA.”¹

Frequently during the study of Orange County history, it is essential to know the names of various roads, waterways and other geographical features. These photo clips of the Gilmer map provide knowledge of the numerous fords over the Rapidan River during the early days of our county. 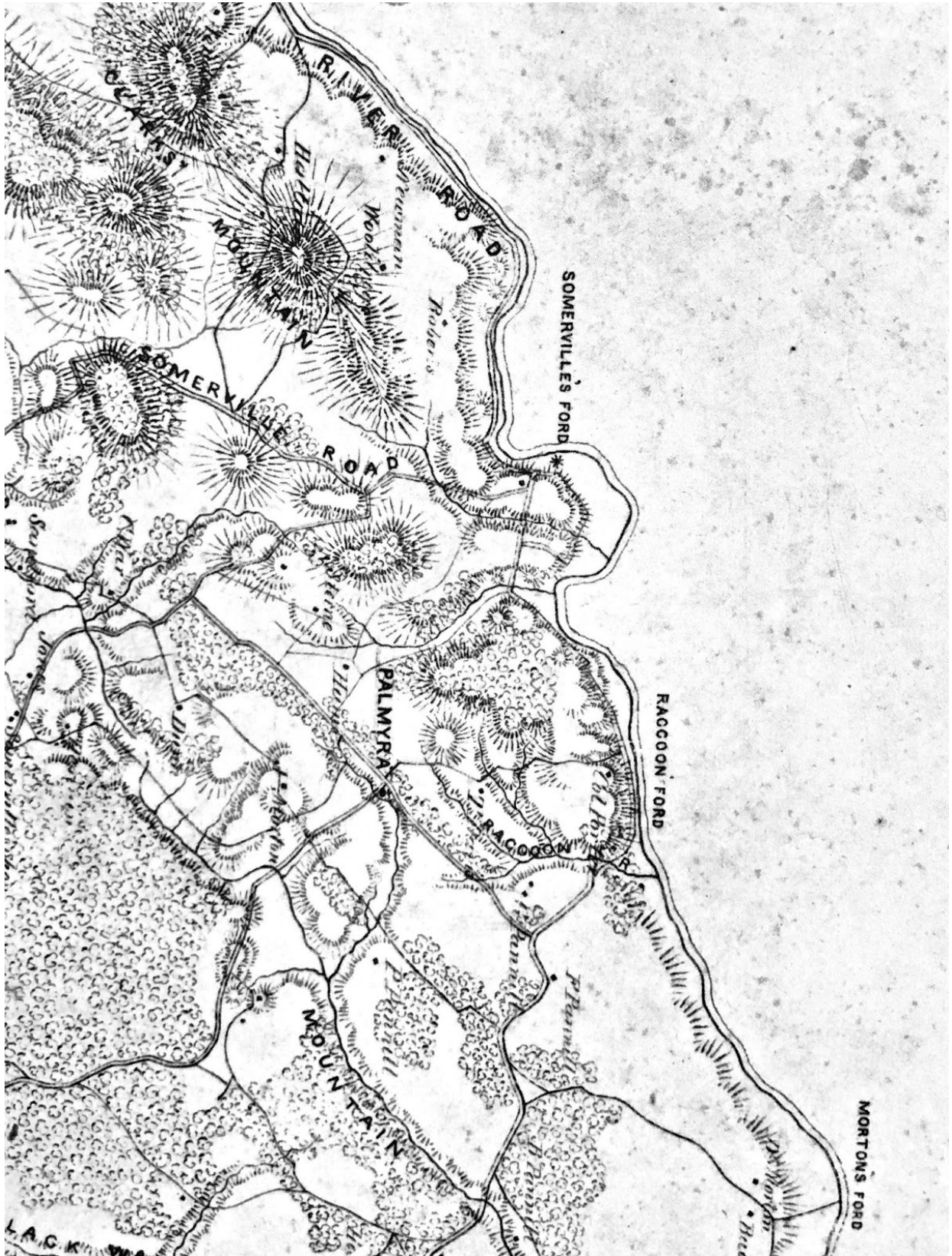
from White's Ford to Liberty Mills (Somerset area) to Walker's Ford



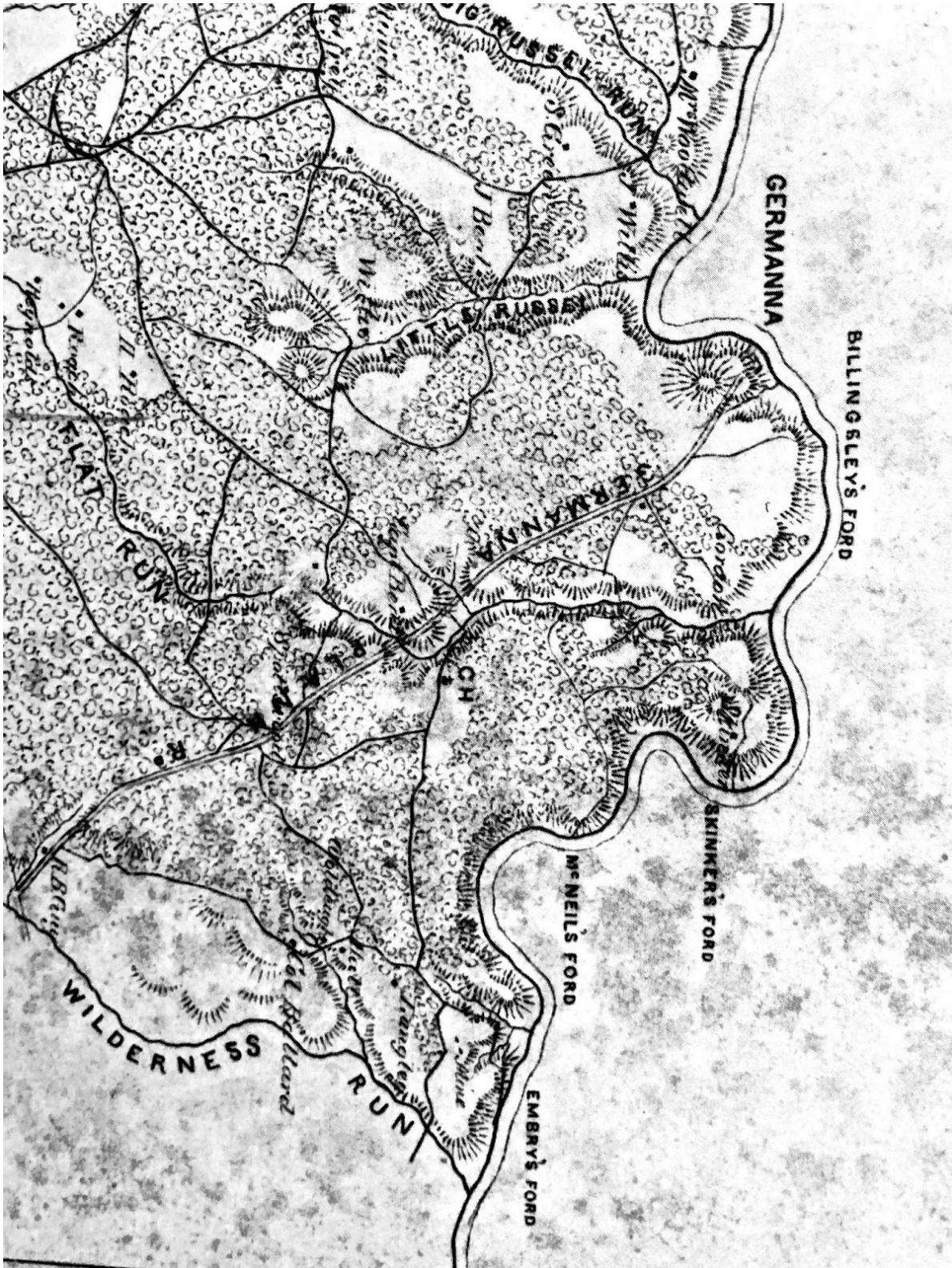
From Somerset to Peyton's Ford, including area north of the town of Orange
